2026 Progressive Dinner Ride



Mt. Pinos ride!

Escape the heat in Frazier Park, CA

July 11, 2026

In the saddle at 10:00 am

Trail Boss: Patty Hug 818-259-4921

Adventure pass required to park at the trailhead.

Pack a lunch, bring a halter/lead and be in the saddle at 10am. The weather should be cooler because the trailhead is at 8300' and Mt. Pinos is at 8800'. It's recommended that horses be shod and in good condition as there are some rocks and decent climbs/descents. We will stop at a nice picnic area for lunch, and there are plenty of trees to tie to.

Directions:

Take Interstate 5 North. 2. Exit at Frazier Park Road. 3. Turn left from the off ramp and drive about 7 or 8 miles. You will go through a stop sign in the community of Frazier Park and mile or two later, a sign that says "Ranger Station/Lockwood Valley" with an arrow pointing left. Don't turn here; keep going straight another 3-4 miles. 4. You will eventually come to a "Y" intersection with a sign with directions to Pine Mountain Club (right) and Mount Pinos (straight), you want to keep going straight. The road to the summit has no markings so if you get past this point and there is a double-yellow line in the road, you're heading towards Pine Mountain Club, not Mount Pinos. 5. Follow this windy road about 8 miles past two yellow snow gates. One gate is at about 1 mile in or so, the other about 5-6 miles in. 6. Near the end there will be a road sign with the words "pavement ends" on it. The parking lot is just around the corner so slow down a bit. 7. Park in the lot facing out so you don't get blocked in.

Other directions:

Drive north on I-5 to the Frazier Park exit. Turn left (west). Note your odometer and go as follows: At 7.2 miles, Lake of the Woods. Here, the Lockwood Valley Road forks left and the Cuddy Valley Road goes straight. Keep straight. At 12.4 miles, junction with Mount Pinos Road (straight) and the Mil Potrero Road (right). Go straight on the Mount Pinos Road. At 22.5 miles, a large paved parking area and a dirt road with a gate on the west (left) side. Park here.

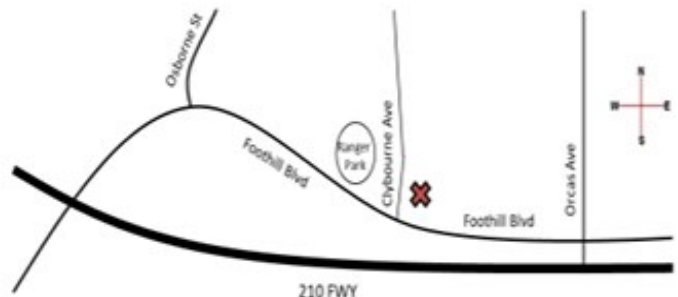
